Get a Vessel Safety Check

Before you launch this spring, get a Vessel Safety Check (VSC) from a qualified vessel examiner of the *United States Power Squadron*, America's Boating Club. If your boat has the proper safety equipment, you will receive a current VSC decal to display on your vessel. If not, you'll know what safety equipment you should add to keep yourself, your boat and your passengers safe. You won't be fined, penalized or reported to any other agency for a failed VSC.

As part of the safety check, the vessel examiner will clarify federal, state and local regulations. He or she may also discuss the purpose of the required marine safety equipment, answer safety-related questions, and be a resource for local boating conditions and information.

Benefits of a VSC

A vessel safety check can help keep you safe and save you money:

- By ensuring that your boat meets federal, state and local safety equipment requirements, you can prevent equipmentrelated citations.
- You may be eligible for boating insurance discounts.



 You can avoid accidents and breakdowns by being more aware of safety practices.

What a VSC covers

A vessel exam only takes 15 minutes and covers:

- Numbering
- Registration
- Life jackets
- Visual distress signals
- Fire extinguishers
- Ventilation
- Backfire flame arrestor
- Horn

- Navigation lights
- Pollution placard
- Trash placard/plan
- Marine sanitation device
- Navigation rules
- State and local requirements
- Overall vessel condition

COMMANDER'S CORNER

The No-Wake Challenge

The Tellico Village (TV) Marine Advisory Committee (MAC) Property Owners Association (POA) Board Liaison set forth a challenge to all TV boaters to minimize unnecessary wakes in and around No Wake Zones. Tellico Cruising Club, the predominant boating club in TV, has been a long-standing supporter of our community.

Wake Zones" essentially mean... Wave Zones. Creating wake in a marked no wake zone can damage property and result in a fine. You will likely see a buoy or sign attached to a dock or boat slip designating the area as a "Idle Speed - No Wake" or "Slow Down - Minimum Wake" zone. Upon entering these zones, it is expected to slow your vessel to maintain headway and steerageway. You will likely see these zones in areas of high boat traffic, swimming, or low-set structures like docks and boat slips. Expect to see plenty of these zones

Any area within 300 feet of a commercial dock is considered a no wake zone by the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA). Large wakes around docks and other boats carry the potential for injury or damage, which is considered reckless operation. Reckless operation carries a \$2,500 fine and a year in jail for any act that endangers life, limb, or property.

Safety is our primary concern. Wakes can cause injury for people that kayak or paddle board around these no wake zones. I know you'll agree with me that we all just want to have fun and be safe on the water, while also respecting other people's property (boats and docks) on the lake.

If you see a fellow boater exceeding the No Wake speed, respectfully ask to SLOW DOWN. If that fails, consider documenting their actions by picture or video, noting the boat registration number (if possible) and send it the POA Help Spot https://tvpoa.helpspot.com/.

Consider scheduling your vessel safety check today. You can also perform a <u>virtual vessel</u> <u>safety check</u> yourself.



Yacht club burgees are an identifying flag of a yacht club, usually triangular with a swallow tail. A Burgee is flown from the masthead, the **bow pulpit**, or from under the starboard spreader (below any courtesy flags). It should always be flown higher than the Ensign.



Anchoring Recommendations for Tellico Lake

There are a few things to consider when choosing the right anchoring system, aka "ground tackle" for your boat.

Anchor Types

<u>Danforth Anchor</u>: Long fluke side blades hold well on all bottoms. However, it can get wedged in underwater tree branches and you may need to cut the line.

<u>Plow Anchor</u>: Shaped like a field plow works well on all bottoms. However, it can get wedged in trees like a Danforth. It can be removed from trees if rigged to pull out backwards under load.

<u>Mushroom Anchor</u>: Round bottom shape. Works well on soft bottoms, less likely to get stuck in trees than a Danforth.

River Anchor: Similar to a Mushroom but with 3 scallop cut outs of the round bottom. This prevents rolling down a steep bottom slope and holds better than a Mushroom.

Anchor weight: Minimum, 1lb per foot of boat length up to as much as you can pull by hand.

Anchor Lines and Chain

Nylon: Good UV resistance and stretch for dampening shock. "3 Strand" is preferred.

<u>Polyester</u>: Not as strong as Nylon but has fair UV and abrasion resistance.

<u>Line diameters:</u> 3/8" or larger is typical. If the rope is too large it may not go through your cleat. The larger the line, the easier it is on your hands when pulling.

<u>Line length</u>: Anchor line, for the lake, should be at least 100' or longer.

<u>Chain</u>: Standard 1/4" or 3/8" galvanized chain is recommended to help keep the **shank** of the anchor on the bottom, to prevent anchor drag. For lake use, try a chain length of 5'-10'.

For the ocean it should be the length of your boat or longer. **G4** style anchor chain links are used on most Windlass anchor motor cogs, standard chain links will not fit in a windlass cog. When anchor line and chain are connected together, it's called "**Anchor Rode**".

When anchoring, the USCG recommends at least a 7:1 scope. Scope=Depth of water x 7'. Ex: 20' depth needs 140' of rode out. Beware that the more line that is out can snag trees and rocks on the bottom and have a larger "swinging circle" when the wind shifts. When setting the anchor, let out rode until the anchor hits bottom. Put the boat in reverse and pay out a good scope length. Put the boat in neutral and wrap the line around the front cleat. Feel the anchor grab the bottom and stop the boats momentum. If your anchor is stuck, try reversing the direction the rode was paid out, take the line slack out and tie off to a strong rear cleat. Motor forward to pull it loose. Watch the propeller doesn't get fouled with line. If it won't come free, tie a buoy to the line and leave it until someone can help you retrieve it Mark its location with GPS

When connecting the chain to the anchor, use a galvanized **shackle** with thread locker or safety wire on the bolt. When tying the line to the chain you can braid it to the 3 strand Nylon line (recommended for a Windlass) or use an **Overhand Loop** or **Figure 8 Loop** knot. **Do not use a Bowline**, it will work loose off the chain.

RAFT-OFF PROCEDURES AND FAQS

The Cruising Club holds Raft-Offs frequently during the boating season. The purpose of the Raft-Off is to give club members the opportunity to get together and enjoy the lake. Below are some of the frequently asked questions to help you feel more comfortable with the Raft-Off process.


What is a Raft-Off and what goes on there?

A Raft-Off is an opportunity to get together with fellow TCC members and have some fun with our boats on the lake. We tie our boats together (generally in a line) such that we can walk from boat to boat. We swim, talk, eat, drink and generally have a lot of fun.

Do I need any special equipment on my boat to join a Raft-Off?

Any equipment needed for a Raft-Off should already be on your boat. Most importantly, a VHF radio is required. In addition, you will need fenders, lines, a boat hook and potentially an anchor. You should have at least four fenders of the size appropriate for your boat. However, more fenders and larger ones allow you to better buffer your vessel. You'll need at least 3 lines - a bow line, a stern line at least 15' long and at least one spring line at least 25' in length. Lines should be of the size recommended for your vessel. Additional lines can be helpful to better secure your vessel. An extendable boat hook is handy for transferring lines and pulling boats together. You can be asked to set an anchor when joining the Raft-Off, so you should have an anchor appropriate for your boat. The anchor should be properly rigged and have sufficient line (generally 100' or more). Finally, don't forget your TCC burgee!
