Spring Prep: Guide to "Waking Up" an Outboard Motor

Winter has given way to spring and guess what? It's time to get your outboard motor ready for the season ahead!

Your outboard spring commissioning tasks will vary according to the maintenance you completed in the fall as part of winterization. This check-list assumes that in the fall, you treated the fuel system with a stabilizer, flushed your outboard with antifreeze, changed the lower unit gear oil, treated the cylinders with fogging oil and for four-stroke motors, changed the crankcase oil.

You can either choose to do these tasks yourself or have a professional do it. However, it is wise that you understand the process and address it. Step 1: Visually inspect the motor.

Remove the cowl and give the motor a visual inspection. Look for any evidence of rodent infestation in the form of bits of paper or chew marks on hoses and wiring. Pay particular attention to electrical wiring harnesses, fuel hoses and connections. Double check the spark plug connections and make sure the connectors are firmly pressed into place. If you did not change the **spark plugs** in the fall, now is the time.

Step 2: Check the timing and alternator belts.

Step 3: Check the steering.

Step 4: Test the trim/tilt.



Step 5: Ensure your outboard is securely
attached to the boat.Step 6: Inspect the Anodes.Step 7: Examine the Propeller.Step 8: Change the water pump impeller.Step 9: Connect the fuel tank to the motor.Step 10: Test run the motor.

New Fire Extinguisher Law

New Federal regulations for fire extinguishers on recreational boats will be taking effect on April 20, 2022. The new regulations will be used by the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary when boat inspections are conducted this Spring. The new requirements for fire extinguishers are that if it is older than 12 years from date of manufacture, they are no longer valid, even if the pressure gauge indicates it is still good. Also, every fire extinguisher must have a label stating "Marine Type USCG" on it.

Boaters can find the manufacture date stamped into the bottom of the bottle or near the UL label. Additionally, while the new regulation does not change the type (U.S. Coast Guard-rated) or quantity or requirement for USCG approved fire extinguishers aboard, it does specify the minimum Underwriter Laboratory (UL) classification of extinguishers to be carried aboard certain vessels — depending on the boat's model year.

This is the result of phasing out older "B-I" and "B-II" labels for newer "5-B" "10-B" and "20-B" extinguisher classifications. The number in this new rating refers to the size in square feet of the potential fire the device is suitable to extinguish.

Vessels on the water today that are less than 26 feet and model year 2017 or older may continue to carry older, dated or undated "B-I" or "B-II" disposable extinguishers. However, when they are no longer serviceable or have reached 12 years of age since manufacture, they must be replaced with newer class "5-B" or greater extinguishers. Boats less than 26 feet and 2018 model year or newer must carry unexpired "5-B" "10-B" or "20-B" fire extinguishers. Having older "B-I" and "B-II" types do not meet the new carriage requirements.
